

# TO FIGHT TUBERCULOUS HOME

Citizens of Verona, N. J., Object to  
Any More Public Institutions.

MONTCLAIR, N. J., March 3.—Citizens of Verona, N. J., are indignant over the prospect of having a tuberculosis hospital located in their township by the Newark Board of Health. They say it will retard the present growth of the place and turn away homeseekers. A prominent member of the Verona Improvement Association said to-day that with the County Penitentiary, the Newark City Home for Boys, and the big Overbrook Insane Asylum, Verona already had more than its share of such institutions within close proximity of its residential section.

Last Thursday Dr. H. C. H. Herold, President of the Newark Board of Health, and other city officials visited a house formerly used as a school for girls. They recommended that it be converted into a hospital for consumptives.
